Impact Note: Children at Cotteridge who attract the Pupil Premium Grant, leave the school having achieved a significantly higher standard in Reading, Writing and Maths than similar children nationally. However, they are still behind the attainment of non-disadvantaged pupils nationally. Thus it remains a school priority to close the gap for disadvantaged pupils.
