Maths

How it works:

Maths homework will be sent on a Friday. It is due back the following Wednesday. If you have completed your maths homework, have a go at one of these. You will gain ten house points for each one you try.

A boy watches a video that lasts 75mins and another that lasts 80mins. Can he watch them both in 2 hours? How long do the videos last in minutes/hours?

250 children and 16 adults are going on a school journey. Each coach seats 52 people. How many coaches are needed for the journey?

Paul bought 40 thank you cards. He sent $\frac{1}{4}$ to his family and $\frac{1}{3}$ of the remaining cards to his friends. How many cards did he have left?
