Grammar: Expanded noun phrases, paragraphs, fronted adverbials, speech punctuation, pronouns and nouns.

English

Electricity: Identify common appliances that run on electricity.

Construct a simple series electrical circuit, identifying and naming its basic parts.

Identify whether or not a lamp will light in a simple series circuit.

Recognise that a switch opens and closes a circuit.

Recognise some common conductors and insulators.

States of matter: Compare and group materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases.

Observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled.

Identify the part played by evaporation and condensation in the water cycle and associate the rate of evaporation with temperature.

Science

Multiplication & division: Multiply 2 & 3-digit numbers by a 1-digit number using formal written method. Multiply & divide mentally including by 1 & 0.

Measurement: Convert between different units of measure.

Number & place value: Recognise the place value of each digit in a 4-digit number. Order & compare numbers beyond 1000. Round any number to the nearest 10, 100 & 1000.

Addition & subtraction: Add & subtract numbers with up to 4-digits using the formal written methods. Solve simple 2-step problems.

Fractions: Calculate quantities, including non-unit fractions. Recognise common equivalent fractions. Add & subtract fractions with the same denominator.

Mathematics

Under risk assessed music service planning, exploring woodwind instruments, learning to correctly pitch notes, follow musical notation and in a group, create compositions (clarinet/fife focus).
