- ◆ Write a diary entry to describe Tom's feelings about going to stay on the farm.
- ◆ Design a new book jacket : front cover and blurb.
- ◆ Pretend you are a travel agent and want people to visit the countryside. Draw a picture and write a paragraph on what you would put in the brochure.
- ◆ Write interview questions for a character in the story then write what you think their answers would be.
- ◆ Draw your favourite scene from the book so far.

Maths

How it works:

Maths homework, which will be sent on a Friday, will be stuck in homework books. It is due back the following Wednesday. Each week you must complete the given task as well as Big Maths Beat That!

If you have completed your maths homework, have a go at one of these. You will gain ten house points for each one you try.

Two bookmarks and two notebooks cost £14. A notebook costs three times as much as a bookmark. How much does one notebook cost?

The mass of an apple is half the mass of an orange. The mass of a banana is 15g more than an apple. The total mass of the fruit is 375g. What is the mass of an orange?

There are some apples in bags. The second bag contains twice as many as the first bag. The third bag contains six times as many as the first bag. The second bag contains 90 apples. How many apples are in the third bag?
