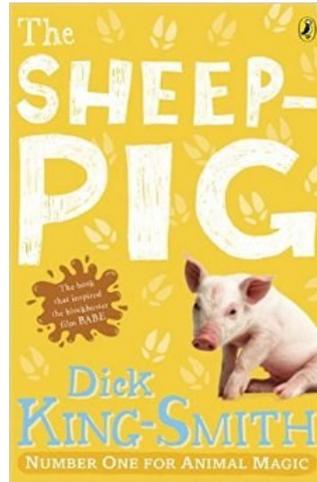

- ◆ Design a new book cover.
- ◆ Write a blurb.
- ◆ Split your page into boxes and create a comic of the story.
- ◆ Draw a timeline of events from the story.
- ◆ Write a character description of one of the main characters.
- ◆ Draw a map of the farm and label the different parts.
- ◆ Write a newspaper article about one of the events in the story.
- ◆ Write a diary entry for Babe when he first arrived at the farm.
- ◆ Write questions that you would ask Mr Hogget in an interview.

Maths

How it works:

Maths homework, which will be sent on a Friday, will be stuck in homework books. It is due back the following Wednesday. Each week you must complete the given task as well as Big Maths Beat That!

If you have completed your maths homework, have a go at one of these. You will gain ten house points for each one you try.

- ◆ If the perimeter of an oblong is 20cm, what could the lengths of the sides be?
- ◆ Which is the odd one out: 200mm, 5cm, 7.5cm, 8cm. Explain your reasoning.
- ◆ How many different combinations of number can you find that would fill the empty boxes?

- ◆ Miss Jones says, "When I add the number of days in 2 different months up, it always makes an odd number." Do you agree? Explain your reasoning.
- ◆ Would you rather $\frac{3}{8}$ of 32 sweets or $\frac{3}{4}$ of 32 sweets? Explain your reasoning.
- ◆ True or false? Some shapes have no angles. Explain your reasoning.
