

- ◆ Find 5 openers in the book that you like and use these to start your own sentences.
- ◆ Write 5 questions that you would like to ask a character and answer them as if you are the character.
- ◆ Write a new blurb and incorporate it in a new back cover.
- ◆ Find 10 words in the text and improve them. You could use a thesaurus to help you.
- ◆ Lila begins to describe her idea to her dad with the word, 'Supposing... Can you find 6 more -ing words and use them in your own wow sentences?
- ◆ In the book, we find out about '3 gifts'. Which 3 gifts do you think we need in life? Explain why.
