

## **Children who are unable to attend because they or a household member are waiting for a test result**

Very often, children display mild symptoms (if any at all) that tend not make them feel too poorly and will not prevent them from learning. Where possible we would like them to engage (for this short period of time) in revising basic skills and follow the guidelines below.

1. We are signposting children to the **Oak National Academy** <https://classroom.thenational.academy/schedule-by-year> for direct work during these short periods of absence. (A daily scheduled timetable is now available on this site with lessons for each year group each day). Please access the relevant year group work for the **calendar days** they are absent i.e.: if they are in Year 3 and are absent on the 21st and 22nd September, please go to the year 3 page and locate learning for these specific dates.
2. A book for 'Home Learning' will be sent so that written activities from the Oak National Academy lessons can be recorded. Please see the sheet inside the Home Learning Book which explains how to access Oak Academy.
3. Please ask your child to clearly date their work. Please only allow your child to use this for lockdown activities.
4. We recommend that your child completes an English, Maths and Topic activity per day from Oak Academy.
5. Please send your child's Home Learning book in to school with them on return so that their teacher can view and feedback on their work.
