<u>School Photographs</u>

On Tuesday 15th September all children will have their individual photograph taken during the school day. Please make sure that they are in uniform and looking smart.

Due to the current situation we will not be able to offer family group or sibling photographs, as this will break our bubbles. We are sure that you understand!



Guidance for families on Covid-19 and illness.

If your child or someone in your household has any **one** of the following:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss of, or change to, your sense of smell or taste

it is important that you do not attend school and stay at home. You should arrange for a coronavirus test and tell the school the test results. Please let the school know the reason for your child's absence.

To book a test call 111 or 119 or go online by searching: NHS get a coronavirus test.

Our local test centre is at the University of Birmingham or a test can be posted to your home address.

If you are unsure what to do, please call either Mrs Burnett or Miss Lacey on 0121 464 2865.

Until we have the results of the test, your child(ren) will be unable to return to school.

Please note, if you have more than one child at school, even if only one child is displaying symptoms, all children must remain off school until the child displaying symptoms has received a negative test result. Alternatively, the child with symptoms may quarantine for 10 days whilst the rest of the household should quarantine for 14 days.

Children should not return to school if they feel unwell. This is even if they have had a negative test result.

If your child has a fever, they should not return to school until their temperature has been normal for 48 hours.

In the event of a positive test result, please call the school office and ask to speak to Mr Willetts or Miss Lacey as soon as you are able.

We understand this is a complicated situation, please feel free to discuss any questions with us.

<u>Birthdays</u>

Birthdays are important to us all but they are particularly important when you are a child. Therefore, to recognise this, when it is a child's birthday they will be able to wear clothes other than their uniform for their special day.

If their birthday falls at a weekend the child can choose whether they wear their non-uniform on the Friday before their birthday or on the Monday following their birthday. If the child's birthday falls within a school holiday they can attend in non-uniform on either the day we break up before the holidays or on the day we return to school.

With regards to sweets etc. being brought into school for birthdays; if you wish to do so please ensure that anything sent in is individually wrapped so that the teacher can give them out. We will not give out anything which is not prewrapped because of possible Covid transmission.

<u>Hand sanitiser</u>

Washing hands and maintaining good levels of hygiene is obviously very important at the moment and we try to ensure that children wash their hands regularly throughout the school day. However to get 30 children to wash their hands in one sink in a classroom is taking a long time and is impacting significantly on learning time.

Therefore from Monday we do intend, at times, to

use hand sanitiser with the children as well as soap and water. Most children are used to using hand sanitiser now and are using it on a regular basis at home.

Sanitiser will speed up hand cleaning significantly, with the teacher able to quickly go around and squirt a small amount into each child's hands.

All sanitiser will be provided by the school and children do not need to bring their own.

We will assume that you give consent for your child to use the hand sanitiser we provide, unless we hear from you to say otherwise. If you don't want them to use it please contact us.
