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Positive Covid-19 Cases Over Christmas

As part of the recent Government announcement, School Leaders were informed that they needed to be available "on call" for the first six days of the holiday. We have a responsibility to support Public Health with contact tracing for positive cases where a child or member of staff has spent any time in school in the 48 hours before the onset of symptoms. This means that once we have broken up today, the 18th December, and a child displays symptoms this Saturday or Sunday, it is important that you inform us. We then have a duty to contact any identified close contacts and instruct them to self-isolate for 10 days.

Please use the form on our website if your child receives a positive test result and they displayed symptoms on Saturday 19th or Sunday 20th December. If your child tests positive, but symptoms did not begin until Monday 21st December, you do not need to notify school but the household must isolate for 10 days from the first sign of symptoms.

Return to School in January

With the relaxed rules for all tiers over the Christmas period, from 22nd to 27th December, to enable families to enjoy a Christmas which is as close to normal as possible, there is likely to be a spike in cases in January. To avoid the potential significant impact on learning, it is very important that no child returns to school if they are displaying any Covid related symptoms, or are unwell in any way. A test should be arranged if they display any of these symptoms:

- \cdot A new, continuous cough
- · A high temperature, specifically over 37.8 degrees
- \cdot A loss of taste and/or smell
- · Birmingham City Council website states that "children may also display gastrointestinal symptoms"

There are other symptoms linked to coronavirus but these are the most prevalent ones. If you have any doubt at all, then please keep your child at home and arrange for them to be tested. If they then receive a negative result they can return to school when they are well enough.
