It's been a busy week at school and I would like to commend all of our children for such a smooth and sensible return. Many seem to have grown up in just the two weeks that they have been away! Also, a warm welcome back to Miss O'Brien, our SENDCO, who has returned from a year's maternity leave. For the next few months, Miss O'Brien will be working three days a week (Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday). It's a good time, at the start of a new year, for me to mention three useful reminders about our school expectations. First of all, a reminder that **school uniform** standards are not optional, this includes the need for proper school shoes and school sweatshirts. Mrs Tucker & Mrs Darby will always make respectful contact with parents of children not wearing school uniform, as it's non-negotiable for a school place at Cotteridge. Sometimes parents of children in Years 5&6 are unaware that children come to school in non uniform items, so for these, a phone call is particularly useful. Another reminder is about how seriously we view **safeguarding** . We have a statutory duty to refer all safeguarding concerns and will always do so. In order to raise the profile of our safeguarding in school, we are introducing a new regular feature to this newsletter entitled 'Safeguarding Update', which Mrs Burnett will use for regular communication. **Attendance** is another matter worthy of mention. Unfortunately, in 2018 there was a significant increase in the number of Cotteridge families who were fined by the Council for taking holiday in term time, or having general attendance of less than 90%. I am not allowed to authorise any holiday in term time and strongly urge parents not to make bookings in advance.

Reading continues to be a whole school priority and so I'm especially proud and excited to announce that all children in the Juniors are going to receive a personal gift next week. I don't believe there is another school in the land that is running such an incentive as the one we are going to introduce next week. Please read 'WE LOVE READING!!' for more information. 

#### WE LOVE READING!!

Our whole school priority in 2019 continues to be encouraging reading for pleasure and also developing children's comprehension skills. The Accelerated Reader Programme continues to be hugely successful in doing this, as does Drop Everything And Read (DEAR). There is a sense of focus on reading as never before, with both children and staff always seeming to be talking about books and what they have read. This can only be a good thing and is at the heart of a quality primary school education! With this priority in mind we are delighted to announce two new initiatives to encourage children to explore books:

- 1. Infant Library: Children in the infants will now be able to access their library every morning during playtime. We are also going to extend after school opportunities so that the infant library will be open 3:15pm to 3:45pm on Mondays and Thursdays with immediate effect. Drop in and have a read!
- 2. A free gift for all children in the juniors!! Hopefully you are aware that we have a 'reading spine' running through the school. This means that half termly class novels are not left to chance or teachers' favourites, but instead are carefully selected and planned to ensure that children are exposed to a wide diet of high quality reading whilst at Cotteridge. If you look on your child's class page on the school website, you will see the book that their teacher will be reading with them this term. Often these books are the focus of much work and discussion during a half term. We are delighted to say that from now on we are going to issue each child with a personal copy of the book, to keep! This means that over their time in the Juniors, they will build up their own



collection of quality texts, which hopefully they will cherish and value forever. During the half term when the book is being used in class, children will be encouraged to bring their personal copy into school every day, but after that the book is theirs.
