I have been so impressed with the children at Cotteridge this week, who continue to be curious to learn and be kind to each other without being the slightest bit distracted as restrictions of the world around them change again. As teachers, we feel privileged to be here to provide a sense of normality for your children every day so that they can learn amongst their friends.

Thank you for your continued co-operation with the wearing of face coverings for drop-off and collection at the beginning and end of the school day. Please could we remind you that it is one adult per family for these drop-offs and collections, to reduce the number of people on the playground at any one time. Today, each child will come home with a poster design sheet for a house competition we are running across school. Their task is to design a poster, thanking parents and carers for following our social distancing rules in the playground. The winners' posters will be displayed outside school.

School has been as busy as ever this week. Children in Key Stage 1 and 2 have been working hard to produce some lovely pieces of writing based on the texts they are reading in English. Year 2 have been planning and writing their own stories based on 'The Flower' while Year 4 have written some fantastic letters in response to their text 'The Firework Maker's Daughter.' Parents' Evening Autumn 2020

Due to the current restrictions around Covid-19 we've had to be inventive with how we conduct this year's Parents' Evenings. This year, instead of Parents/



Carers selecting a day and time to attend school to see their child's class teacher, you will instead be able to select a day and time for your child's class teacher to call you. Your 10 minute telephone appointment slots will be bookable by you on the Teachers 2 Parents website. You should have had your text message from us asking you to book your appointment. If not, please contact us.

Guidance for families on Covid-19 and illness.

If your child or someone in your household has any **one** of the following:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss of, or change to, your sense of smell or taste

it is important that you do not attend school and stay at home. You should arrange for a coronavirus test and tell the school the test results. Please let the school know the reason for your child's absence.

To book a test call 111 or 119 or go online by searching: NHS get a coronavirus test.

Our local test centre is at the University of Birmingham or a test can be posted to your home address.

If you are unsure what to do, please call either Mrs Burnett or Miss Lacey on 0121 464 2865.

Until we have the results of the test, your child(ren) will be unable to return to school.

Please note, if you have more than one child at school, even if only one child is displaying symptoms, all children must remain off school until the child displaying symptoms has received a negative test result. Alternatively, the child with symptoms may quarantine for 10 days whilst the rest of the household should quarantine for 14 days.

Children should not return to school if they feel unwell. This is even if they have had a negative test result.

If your child has a fever, they should not return to school until their temperature has been normal for 48 hours.

In the event of a positive test result, please call the school office and ask to speak to Mr Willetts or Miss Lacey as soon as you are able.

We understand this is a complicated situation, please feel free to discuss any questions with us.

KS1 Free School Meals Taster

On Thursday 1st October we are providing a school dinner food tasting opportunity for children in the infants who usually have a packed lunch. All children will have the opportunity to have a school dinner or even just part of a school dinner. (For example they might just like the look of the pudding.) **Children will not be placed under any pressure at all to eat the food;** the purpose of the exercise is purely to allow children to see what is on offer. It is your right to access a free school dinner if you choose and so it might be good for your children to see the amazing food that is now on offer. **Please still provide your child with a packed lunch on the day if you wish** so that they can revert to this if the school dinner does not appeal to them.



Flu Vaccine

Our school immunisation team have confirmed that they will be coming into school on Friday 16th October 2020 to administer the flu vaccine to our Reception, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 children. Consent forms will be sent out next week. Please could you return your completed consent as soon as practicable, even if you are giving negative consent. Thank you.
