Cotteridge Primary School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of Children.


Make every day count

Pupils cannot achieve their full potential if they do not regularly attend school. We want every child to achieve their full potential and we know that parents share this goal. There is a clear link between good attendance and educational achievement. If your child is not in school, on time, as often as possible, they will be missing out on many important parts of their education.

Punctuality Matters - Being frequently late for school adds up to lost learning.

- Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to over 3 days lost each year
- Arriving 15 minutes late every day adds up to 2 weeks absence a year
- Arriving 30 minutes late every day adds up to 19 days absence a year

The Government regard 95% as the minimum satisfactory attendance for a school pupil. Days off school add up to lost learning. Please don't let your children miss out on the education they deserve. Mr Leonard



Family emergencies need careful consideration. It is not always in the best interests of the pupil to miss school for family emergencies that are being dealt with by adult family members.
