Prince William Award



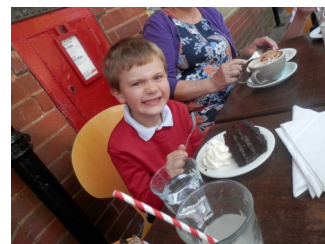
