Reception September 2021

In Birmingham, children can go to school in the September after his or her fourth birthday. So if you have a child, or know anyone who has a child, who will be of age, we would ask you to consider our school and to visit www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions and submit an online application by 15th January 2021 (the final closing date). We would strongly recommend that you ensure you read the 'Primary School Admissions Criteria 2021 Information' prior to submitting your application. This year, due to the restrictions around Covid, we are unable to hold our open sessions in the usual way. Therefore, we will be featuring a virtual tour of Cotteridge School on our website later this month. If you have any questions about your child starting school, please do not hesitate to contact a member of Children's Services on 0121 303 1888 where staff will be pleased to offer assistance. Behaviour Policy: Covid -19 adjustment

happy to help.

In line with government guidance we have amended our behaviour policy and this has been agreed by governors. The new policy is now to be found in the parents' section of the website. The most important change is that we need to take deliberately coughing or spitting on another child at school more seriously: these behaviours are now considered significant. The changes have been explained to the children in an age appropriate manner both in class and in an assembly. We hope that we have your support in working with the children to ensure that if these behaviours happen, we can prevent an reoccurrence to keep everyone safe.

Guidance for families on Covid-19 and illness for children at school.

If your child or someone in your household has any **one** of the following:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss of, or change to, your sense of smell or taste

it is important that you do not attend school and stay at home. You should arrange for a coronavirus test and tell the school the test results. Please let the school know the reason for your child's absence.

To book a test call 111 or 119 or go online by searching: NHS get a coronavirus test. Our local test centre is at the University of Birmingham or a test can be posted to your home address. Until we have the results of the test, your child(ren) will be unable to return to school.

Please note, if you have more than one child at school, even if only one child is displaying symptoms, all children must remain off school until the child displaying symptoms has received a negative test result. Alternatively, the child with symptoms may quarantine for 10 days whilst the rest of the household should quarantine for 14 days.

Children should not return to school if they feel unwell. This is even if they have had a negative test result. If your child has a fever, they should not return to school until their temperature has been normal for 48 hours.

In the event of a positive test result, please call the school office and ask to speak to Mr Willetts or Miss Lacey as soon as you are able.

Please could you return your completed consent as soon as practicable, even if you are giving negative consent, no later than Friday 9th October. Thank you.



Secondary School Applications

Just a reminder that the deadline for applying for a secondary school place is fast approaching. Applications must be submitted by 31st October 2020. It is really important that you apply on time. If you apply late you are less likely to get offered a place at any of your preferred schools. Applications received after the 31st October 2020 will be classed as late applications and will not be processed until after the offer of places on 1st March 2021.
