Birthdays

Birthdays are important to us all but they are particularly important when you are a child. Therefore, to recognise this, when it is a child's birthday they will be able to wear clothes other than their uniform for their special day.

If their birthday falls at a weekend the child can choose whether they wear their non-uniform on $Birthd_{ay}$ the Friday before or on the Monday following their birthday. If the child's birthday falls within a

school holiday they can attend in non-uniform on either the day we break up before the holidays or on the day we return to school.

With regards to sweets etc. being brought into school for birthdays; if you wish to do so please ensure that anything sent in is individually wrapped so that the teacher can give them out. We will not give out anything which is not prewrapped because of possible Covid transmission.

Pick Up From School

Occasionally, collection arrangements do change due to circumstances beyond your control. Should you wish for someone other than yourself to collect your child(ren), please advise us by telephoning the school office. If possible, please do this before 3:00pm as it can be difficult to pass messages to teachers when they have already left their classrooms to take the children to their collection points. Please note: if we have not had a message from you to say that someone else will be collecting your child(ren), we will not let your child(ren) go with them. Thank you for your understanding and co-operation with this.

School Trips

We are really pleased that school trips are able to take place again. The first trips to be announced are for Years 3, 4 and 6 with others to follow soon. Can we remind parents to return their consent slips for these asap. Also, we wanted to make you aware that payment for trips are going to be slightly different this year. Instead of making one large payment at the beginning of the year, we are going to be asking for payment for each trip individually. This is because, due to the ongoing uncertainty with Covid, there is the risk that some trips may be cancelled/postponed, so we thought it is best to only ask for payment once each trip is confirmed. You will be made aware of the amount and when the payment is due when the trip letters are sent home.

If you require further support, please contact one of our Assistant Head Teachers: Mrs Darby for Nursery to Year 2 or Mrs Tucker for Year 3 to Year 6.

Medicines In School

Parents should administer medicines to their child at home where possible. This may be by spacing the doses so that they are not required within school hours. However, if



medicines do need to be administered during the school day, then a parent MUST bring it to the school office and fill in a consent form for us to do this. **MEDICATION MUST NOT BE BROUGHT IN BY THE CHILD THEMSELVES OR GIVEN TO THEIR CLASS TEACHER!** Our Administration of Medicines Policy can be found on our school website.
