#### Traffic Outside School

A few parents have mentioned to us that they are becoming increasingly worried about the amount of traffic outside school. Not only is this a concern for the



environment, but also for safety – lots of vehicles along the road makes it very difficult for families to cross safely. Sadly, there are also some parents who park on the double yellow lines or the zig zags directly outside the school gates, particularly when dropping off at or collecting from breakfast/after school club. Please be aware: THIS IS ILLEGAL! Please do not park on double yellow lines or the zig zags at any time! It is important that everyone parks legally and considerately to keep everyone safe.

It has also been mentioned that a lot of people leave their engines idling when waiting for children outside school and this is likely to increase as the weather gets colder. They feel that the pollution from idling engines disproportionally affects small children and babies as they are low down, which is where the worst of the pollution is. Please consider switching off your engines when waiting in your cars. Thank you.
