Alongside the Hallowe'en half term finale, children in Years 3 and 4 have been developing their cycling skills, while others have learned to ride a bike this week-amazing! Amongst all the excitement, learning still continues. In Nursery, the children have been reading the Gingerbread Man and today have been decorating their biscuits. Elsewhere in the Key stage One building, the children have been practising their writing and working hard with their sentence structure and number work-it's wonderful to see the children using counters, cubes and objects to help them with their learning. I have had the pleasure of teaching in Year 4 this week and the children were impressing me with their expanded noun phrases-Thomas literally knocked me off my feet when he told me that we were using prepositional phrases! I have also been teaching Year 3 in which the characters in their stories were caught in a storm-they were very exciting to read and the children enjoyed reading them to their partner and taking advice on how to improve their work. In Year 6 we are continuing to enjoy our class novel and have created some lovely writing in the role of one of the characters-it's a book that is certainly keeping us gripped and we can't wait to finish it. Year 5 have been continuing with their science topic and have been separating materials-how to separate a staples, rice, sand and salt mixture certainly caused some debate!

As we break up for the week, I wish you all a happy and safe holiday and hope you all have a good rest before the return to what is always a busy festive season.
