We have again received an increase in complaints from local residents about parents/carers speeding, parking on yellow lines, parking on pavements and blocking driveways. Even more worrying, local residents

As a result, we have reported this to the Police who will be carrying out regular observations and patrols in the local vicinity of school during drop off and pick up times.
