From 3rd May 2022 we will be increasing the price of our school dinners from £2.30 to £2.40 per day. This is not a decision we have taken lightly, but our

suppliers have increased their costs to us and unfortunately, this means that we also need to increase ours.

The daily cost of school dinners remains heavily subsidised by school and until now, we have managed to avoid increasing our prices for over three years.

School dinners will continue to be free for children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 and for children who are entitled to free school meals. If you are unsure if your child is entitled to free school meals, please contact the school office who will be able to advise you on how to apply.

We appreciate that this comes at a time when prices are rising in many areas of our lives, but we hope you understand our decision.

Children and young people aged 18 years and under who have a positive test result



It is no longer recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional.

If a child or young person has a

positive COVID-19 test result, they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test, if they can. After 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults are.

Children and young people who usually go to school, college or childcare and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal..
