Key Instant Recall Facts (KIRF's)

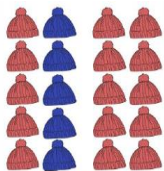

Key Instant Recall Facts are number facts that we want our children to be fluent with and able to recall instantly.

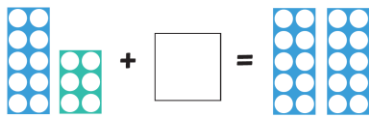
By the end of this half term children in year 2 should be able to

recall number facts to 20

What this looks like:



I have 20 hats.
5 are blue and 15 are red.



$$0 + 20 = 20$$

$$1 + 19 = 20$$

$$2 + 18 = 20$$

$$3 + 17 = 20$$

$$4 + 16 = 20$$

$$5 + 15 = 20$$

$$20 = 14 + \text{star}$$

$$\text{star} + 6 = 20$$



$$\square + \square = 20$$

Roll a dice. What is the number fact to make 20?

Get an adult to write some pairs to 20 on pieces of paper. Face them down.

Turn over two cards and if they make 20, you win.
