Key Instant Recall Facts are number facts that we want our children to be fluent with and able to recall instantly.

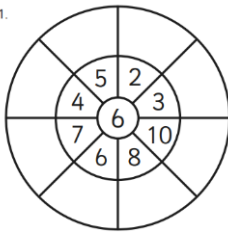

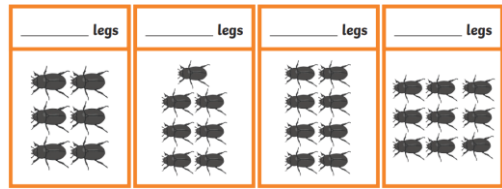
What this looks like:
