## How it works:

These are the spellings your child will see each week on Spelling Shed. Each Friday your child will see a new list of spellings to learn at home. A dictation will take place the following Wednesday to test how well your child has learned their spellings. Your child's spelling score will be sent home in the front of their CGP homework book. Spellings will be sent home over the half term holiday ready for a test the first week back.

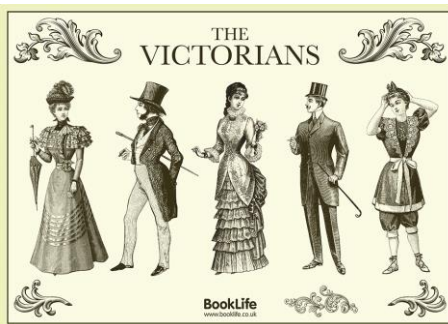

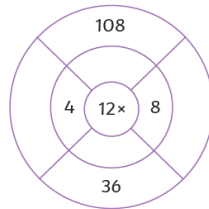
