Animals Including Humans:

Notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults.

Find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air).

Describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene

*Do taller children have bigger hands?

*How does a tadpole change over time?

Plants:

Observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants.

Find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy

*Comparing plant growth in different conditions

*Do bigger seeds grow into bigger plants?

Science

Maths

Number: Applying knowledge of mental and written methods .

Recognise and use the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction and use this to check calculations and solve missing number problems

Multiplication: Recall and use times and divide for 2,5,10 times tables

Measure: Recognise and use symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p).

Combine amounts to make a particular value. Find different combinations of coins that equal the same amounts of money.

Solve simple problems in a practical context involving addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change.

Tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.

Know the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day compare and sequence intervals of time.

Statistics: Interpret and construct tally charts, block diagrams and simple tables.

Ask and answer questions about totalling and comparing categorical data.

Ask and answer simple questions by counting the number of objects in each category and sorting the categories by quantity.

Art

- To look at and respond to the work of John Banting
-Print with hard and soft materials, e.g. corks, pens, cotton reels, sponges

DT:

Design and make a healthy snack that would be suitable to take to the beach (Frozen Fruit yoghurt Lolly)
Discuss where food comes from and what it means to have a healthy, balanced diet.

History

Children will learn about Queen Elizabeth I and Queen Elizabeth II, comparing their roles and the times they lived in. They will find out that Elizabeth I ruled in Tudor times, had great power, defeated the Spanish Armada and led a ‘Golden Age’, while Elizabeth II became queen in 1952, had less direct power and was Head of the Commonwealth. Pupils will also explore how Tudor schooling was very different from today.

Enquiry: How were the lives and roles of Elizabeth I and Elizabeth II similar and different?

RE: Being reflective and self-critical, Being attentive to the sacred as well as the precious, Being imaginative and exploratory, Appreciating beauty

PHSE: Relationships

To know that everyone’s family is different, families function when there is trust and respect, identify reasons friends have conflict, to understand how to solve friendship problems. Reflect upon different types of physical contact in relationships, which are acceptable and which are not.

PHSE: Changing me

To know the physical differences between male and female bodies, to know who to ask for help if they are worries, to know the correct names for private body parts, to know private body parts are private, to know that their bodies have changed from when they were a baby and will continue to change

PSHE & RE

Athletics: Using arms and keeping head still when exploring running patterns. Throw in correct stance ‘Usain Bolt position’. Use arms to improve jumping technique – beating their own score Compete in a team in various running/obstacle games and working together to improve team performance. Leaping over hurdles beginning to compete against self and others.

Dance Move in time to the music showing some expression Perform dance movements with control I Perform dance movements showing a variety of levels Perform dance movements showing travelling in different directions e.g. sliding, turning, gesturing Remember simple dance steps, perform with control in time to the music:

Kwik Cricket: Roll and stop a ball with control/accuracy. Throw underarm with some accuracy and catch a ball.

Bowl underarm towards a target with control and accuracy. Begin to hold the bat in correct position and hit a ball off a tee. Play a modified game encouraging teamwork when fielding. Small sided games using various types of equipment. Develop tactics for striking and fielding.

Football: Stopping a ball with the sole and inside of feet Pass the ball to a partner P,P,P, Plant, Pass Point to help with accuracy Dribble the ball with the inside of feet, keeping the ball close to their body- dribble into a space Improve tackling by using adapted games- introduce intercepting play Scoring in a variety of ways and begin to use in a game situation Begin to include some basic tactics for attacking and defending in conditioned games. Plan an adapted and conditioned 5v5 game.
